The applied theatre specialization focuses on more than just acting. This program combines practical theatre learning with the study of many other disciplines. Students also have the opportunity to complete two, 3-credit work placements where they can apply the skills they've learned in the classroom.

As a student in our program, you will develop traditional theatrical skills such as acting, writing, directing and technical production. You will study improvisation and collective creation. And to help make use of those skills, you'll also study the traditions of dramatic literature and performance theory.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Students enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts Community Studies Applied Theatre Specialization are required to complete 30 credits in the BACS core as part of their four-year degree. The core includes two 3-credit work placements (COMS 2101 and 3101) and (for students in the 4-year degree) a full-year self-directed project (COMS 4100); all 12 credits must focus on applied theatre. The Bachelor of Arts option for applied theatre allows for a 3-year degree.

Students will receive a 3 or 4-year Canadian university degree upon the successful completion of the program.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the program must have completed five Grade 12 advanced or academic courses including English with an overall average of at least 65%. Applicants must successfully complete the IELTS exam with a score of 6.5 band average with no individual section score less than 6.0.
