PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Options for the English degree within the Bachelor of Arts degree program:

- BA three-year Concentration (30 credits in English)
- BA Major (48 credits in English)
- BA Double Major (36 credits in English)
- BA four-year Honours (66 credits in English)

Students will receive a 3 or 4-year Canadian university degree upon the successful completion of the program.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the program must have completed five Grade 12 advanced or academic courses including English with an overall average of at least 65%. Applicants must successfully complete the IELTS exam with a score of 6.5 band average with no individual section score less than 6.0.
